Executive Summary

Deliverable D6.2 'Project Website' presents the results of the work implemented by ARMOUR Work Package 6 Team towards the development and release of a modern, attractive and user-friendly project website with useful information and interactive modules.

It serves as a communication and dissemination tool and is a vital part of the project life, being a resource for information, collaboration and multi-spectral dissemination of results to all stakeholders of the project.

ARMOUR website is designed in a way to allow users to readily collect online information about the project issues, activities, events and achievements, which might be of interest to the different target audiences. It is available in English at <http://armourproject.eu/>.

Deliverable D6.2 first provides information regarding the domain name and hosting of the website. Its visual identity based on the colour scheme of the ARMOUR logo is also described in the document.

Further on, the deliverable presents ARMOUR website structure, which contains two main parts: a publicly available content area, and an Intranet Section. A separate Administrative Panel is developed to serve for the project website maintenance and further development.

The overall structure of the website consists of:

- 'Home' page;
- pages dedicated to present all project related issues, i.e.
 - Project-related:
 - 'ARMOUR' [Know more about the project] Section providing information on the overall project context and objectives, methodology, work packages, added value, consortium members, etc.;
 - 'Media' [Stay informed] Section serving as a repository for communication materials (newsletters, briefs, brochure, factsheet, press releases, logo, etc.);
 - 'News' [Learn more and pay attention] Section providing for ARMOUR most recent developments and listing RSS news related to radicalization and related topics;
 - Related to specific project activities:
 - 'Research & Tools' [Follow our activities and findings] Section providing detailed

information on research activities and focus groups in WP2, learning by doing activities under WP3, and activities, documents and findings under WP4 and WP5; and serving as a repository for project deliverables and project-related resources (guidelines, best practices, tools, etc. Developed by third parties);

- ‘Experimental Labs’ [For first line practitioners working with children and youth] Section providing more detailed information on activities, materials and events related to the experimental labs;
- ‘TTT Programme’ [For first line practitioners and CSOs] Section providing more detailed information on activities, materials and events related to the train the trainer programme.

- interactive modules linked to different website pages and functionalities; and
- Intranet Module dedicated to the overall management of the internal project communication and activities and serving both as storage space and internal communication tool.

Detailed description and snapshots of the different page types are provided in the document for better presentation of the structure and content of ARMOUR website.

Deliverable D6.2 also includes description of the ‘Website Administration’ which covers both the publicly available content area and the Intranet Section.

Information is provided about the structure of the separate Administrative Panel developed to serve for the overall project website maintenance and further development, as well as the terms of access and allowed actions by team members and administrators.

Furthermore, the deliverable presents the ‘General Terms and Conditions for Use of Information Services and Content Accessible Through the ARMOUR Website’ document (‘General Terms and Conditions for Use’), including ARMOUR Privacy Policy, which contains the general terms and conditions of the contract for the use of the information services and resources provided by the administrator through ARMOUR website and regulates the relations between the administrator and any user of the services and resources accessible through ARMOUR website.

Finally, the document describes the planned and ongoing process of website maintenance and updates: the maintenance relates both to the current management of the domain name “armourproject.eu”, the website hosting, and technical maintenance, as well as the long-term strategy for the website functioning which is aimed at sustaining the project outputs and continue its life.
